Malta gained independence from the

British in 1964 and joined the European Union on 1st May 2004.

GETTING AROUND

Driving is on the left, so unless you come from the UK or Ireland you need to be especially careful crossing roads. What will probably surprise you is that there are no trains or underground transport systems in Malta. It is still easy to travel from one place to another using public buses. ACCOMMODATION AND MEALS

Depending on your taste and budget, accommodation prices in St. Julians and the surrounding area during July and August will range between €50 to €135 per night. We will be able to assist you in selecting appropriate accommodation. If you are still looking for a place to stay, we suggest you have a look for hotels in St. Sliema Julians, or Gzira www.offtomalta.com. A typical meal in a normal restaurant or pizzeria, including a drink will cost around €10 - €15. We will be serving tea, coffee and drinks during morning and afternoon breaks on course days and also lunch in the mid-day break, these are included in the meals and excursions package fee. Participants will need to make their own arrangements for the evening meal. We will be able to suggest places to go to and make reservations for you. We would like you to join us for evening meals as part of the cultural programme on Monday and Thursday -(these meals are not included in fee).

COURSE VENUE

The course venue is St. Clare's College Triq Sir Adrian Dingli, Pembroke. The school is housed in an historical building which was completed in 1939 as a hospital and was used for various activities by the British forces until 1979. The interior has been recently refurbished to transform it into a modern school with all the amenities expected including air-conditioned computer laboratories and recreational and sports facilities. The school enjoys open sea views and natural surroundings. It is located in Pembroke, very close to the town of St. Julian's which is a popular tourist spot offering a wide selection of hotels and apartments. From Sliema, Gzira and St. Julian's, you can take a bus to the school - this will take about 15-20 minutes. You can take buses 13, 212 or 222.

FEES

We have organised a varied cultural programme for participants during which we will enable you to visit various attractions in Malta and provide tours conducted by professional guides. We invite


you to bring your own digital cameras and video cameras along so that we could work with some of your own material during the course and workshops.
